

### **Religious Education Committee Draft Job Description**

Needed: Persons interested in the guiding of young people associated with Friends Meeting of Louisville, on a Quaker journey, through the provision of curriculum based in Judeo-Christian Scripture, Quaker History, as well as the beliefs and values of the Religious Society of Friends.

Such Committee members will make themselves available for one year, at least once, and no more than twice, monthly, to supervise, and share Quaker Faith and Values with our children during silent worship. This can be done in either a leadership, or in a supportive role, demonstrating what it is to walk in the Light of the Spirit, through story, various art forms, through play, and/or interaction with one another, toward goals including, but not limited to: Simplicity, Peacemaking, Integrity, Community, Equality, and Sustainability. These efforts will, hopefully, strengthen skills our children will need to recognize Continued Revelation in days to come, resulting, in part, from good memories of time spent in First Day School at Friends Meeting of Louisville.

Such committee/team members will need to be willing to participate in training for the use of curriculum, as well as for pastoral aspects of the outreach. They will need to help organize and maintain supplies for the use of the Education Effort, from time to time, and be in compliance with State and Meeting Child Protection expectations, which will, hopefully, serve to make us a more welcoming community, with time.
